

Huntsman Cancer Institute is seeking applicants for the Community Outreach and Prevention Education Program Internship.

Selected interns will join an established team devoted to creating long-term solutions to prevent cancer and improve the health of individuals, families, and communities—especially those disproportionately affected by cancer. Interns assist with planning, organizing, implementing, and evaluating projects in collaboration with community partners across Utah. Projects focus on cancer risk factors, prevention and screening, vaccination, and lifestyle behaviors.
