

Global health seeks to improve health and health equity for all people worldwide, not just among individual nations. As such, completion of the Global Health certificate will prepare students to: (1) understand important concepts and principles associated with global health; (2) collaborate and partner with global health stakeholders; and (3) address health disparities among underserved and at-risk populations. Students will receive a certificate from the Department of Public Health. Completion of certificates is *not* noted on academic transcripts.

### Eligibility

Only matriculated Master of Public Health (MPH) students at Brigham Young University are eligible for a global health certificate.

### Requirements

1. Complete two certificates from the Global Health eLearning Center (<http://globalhealthlearning.org/>). See “certificate programs” and select from child survival, cross-cutting, family planning and reproductive health, gender and health, health systems, HIV/AIDS, infectious diseases, maternal health, and neonatal health.
2. Students must complete 18 credits (4 classes plus field experience) in order to earn the Global Health certificate.

<sup>a</sup> MPH students can count up to 10.0 credits of 300/400 level courses toward their MPH degree, but not more than 10.0 credits. Only one 300 level course may be counted. Students must petition to Graduate Studies for approval to count a 300-level course.

<sup>b</sup> If any listed course(s) were taken as part of an undergraduate degree, then students must substitute the course(s) with another approved elective.

<sup>c</sup> Changes to certificate course requirements must be approved by the Global Health certificate lead, Dr. Ben Crookston, and MPH Director, Dr. Ali Crandall.

<sup>d</sup> Students must petition to Graduate Studies for approval to count a 300-level course.

### **Field Experience and “R” Courses Requirements**

Students need to complete a field experience (HLTH 688R) in global health as approved by their graduate faculty advisor. This means fieldwork will focus on an underserved or marginalized population, typically in an international setting. Fieldwork associated with the BYU Global Health Internship Program is recommended and encouraged.

Students choosing to complete HLTH 603R – Special Topics in Public Health, HLTH 691R – Mentored Research, and/or HLTH 696R – Independent Studies as an elective(s) are required to focus on topics, readings, research, or studies among underserved or marginalized populations, typically in an international setting.
