

RESEARCH VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR BYU RESEARCH STUDY

A study conducted by Dr. Jayson Gifford to determine
IF DAILY **SAUNA** THERAPY CAN PROTECT **CARDIOVASCULAR HEALTH** DURING
TIMES OF **LOW PHYSICAL ACTIVITY**

To be in the study, participants must be...

- 18+ years old (Male or Female)
 - Women must not be pregnant
- Willing to perform intense exercise
- Available for 12 visits over the course of 3 weeks (Most are 1-2 hours long, 2 will be ~ 5 hours long)
- Physically active
- Free from cardiovascular and metabolic disease
- Not taking cardiovascular medications (e.g., blood pressure medication)
- Not habitually using sauna or hot tub
- No history of heat-related illness
- Non-smoker

Participants will be compensated
\$700 upon completion.

Compensation will be prorated (\$20 per visit) if all visits are not completed.

Participants will undergo 7-consecutive days of sauna bathing and may be asked to use an power wheelchair the majority of the day (e.g., during work, school, and home time) to reduce physical activity during those 7 days. Intense exercise and procedures involving needles, like blood draws and 2 muscle biopsies, are involved in this study.



Who: university (undergraduate or graduate) students or recent graduates seeking an applied evaluation and/or public health internship experience

What: an applied internship position to support the development and implementation of public health evaluation projects, including needs assessments and impact evaluation. Other duties as assigned at the discretion of the supervisor (PHIG Evaluator) and in alignment with intern interest.
