

CONFERENCE PURPOSE & OBJECTIVES

To unite individuals working with those at-risk for, or dealing with, substance use issues with or without co-occurring disorders to reduce stigma, increase knowledge and improve access to, and practices around substance use issues facing today's diverse society. Doing this and capturing new/improved best practices in all levels (prevention to recovery and wellness) throughout public and private settings, there will be improvements in system and individual outcomes.

- Provide education, collaboration building, resource enhancements, and stigma reduction to create improvements in services and practices from prevention to intervention and recovery around substance use disorders.
- Provide a safe forum to identify system and service gaps and develop collaboratives from prevention to tertiary interventions and recovery to fill those gaps in all cultural and ethnic populations dealing with substance use issues.
- Develop strategies to promote the healthy growth and development of individuals more effectively in all developmental stages and various cultural/ethnic backgrounds who are dealing with issues of substance use, misuse, and abuse.
- To provide and strengthen effective working tools to properly intervene in said issues on individual and system levels.
- To familiarize participants with current policies, resources, and resource needs in an environment that facilitates interdisciplinary, collaborative networking.

Student selection will be based on ensuring an interprofessional student attendance from multiple schools. Once attendees have been selected, the UROHC-CCM team will reach out with next steps.


